June 1977

January 1978

NCIA prepares our first Client Specific Plan (now Criminal Justice Services)

February 1978

Dr. Jerry Miller and Herb Hoelter conduct the first study of mental health services on Riker's Island, New York

June 1978

NCIA helps decarceration efforts of youth in four jurisdictions: Utah, Maryland, Puerto Rico and New York City

January 1979

Lindsay Hayes, NCIA's third employee, conducts the first national study of jail suicides. He eventually becomes the nation's foremost expert on the prevention of jail and prison suicides

June 1980

NCIA opens 15 offices across the country to prepare Client Specific Plans for over 10,000 criminal defendants



June 1980-1987

NCIA is hired by the State of Maryland to develop community placements for 225 youth held in two separate juvenile institutions

June 1985

NCIA opens The Augustus Institute, the first outpatient clinic for sexual offenders

July 1987

NCIA sponsors an international conference "Reaffirming Rehabilitation" attended by over 300 professionals

September 1987

NCIA is hired by the State of Hawaii to help close a juvenile prison

January 1988

NCIA is hired by the District of Columbia to assist in placing 110 youthful offenders from a juvenile prison into community-based settings

February 1989

NCIA is hired by the State of Delaware to develop community-based placements for youth in custody

April 1989



NCIA is hired by New York City to provide case management services for release of detained youth

July 1989

NCIA is hired by the Florida Division of Children, Youth and Families to operate a 20-bed secure residential treatment center

September 1989

Dr. Jerry Miller is appointed as Federal Monitor of Duval County Florida Jail lawsuit

July 1989



NCIA develops new model of care — Alternative Living Units — for people with disabilities

January 1990

NCIA assists Maryland in developing alternatives for children in mental hospitals to settle a Federal "Lisa L" lawsuit
